KHDA PARENT- SCHOOL CONTRACT

When a child has been admitted to a school in Dubai, he or she must be registered with the KHDA (Knowledge and Human Development Authority) and parents are required to sign the KHDA Parent-School Contract before joining the school.

KHDA Registration Process

- We will need your child's Emirates ID copy and one of the parent's Emirates ID with a valid parent's email and UAE phone number.
- Students transferring from schools within Dubai or another emirate can be registered with the students' leaving certificate and EID copies.
- Parents will receive a notification that the KHDA Parent-School Contract is published and ready to be signed.
 - If the child was registered by his/her Emirates ID, parents should be able to sign the contract online through the KHDA parent portal via KHDA app or website (<https://www.khda.gov.ae>).
 - If the student was registered with the passport copies because the Emirates ID is not yet issued or provided, parents are required to sign the contract manually on the signature pad.
 - If more than one child, parent need to sign the KHDA School Contract for each child.

*Please note that all new students need to register and sign the contract before school starts.



ADMISSION PROCESS

CURRICULUM

Deira Private School follows the National Curriculum for England and is open from Foundation Stage 2 (aged 3+) to Year 9 (aged 14+). Within this framework, we are also mindful of the fact that our school will be truly international in its character, as well as respecting our host country's vision, history, and traditions. This will be achieved through high-quality learning in lessons, an extensive range of enrichment activities, and a truly personalized educational experience for each child.

Specialist Teaching

Languages

Languages are delivered and developed through our curriculum in English, Arabic, and French. In compliance with the Ministry of Education guidelines, teaching of Arabic is offered from FS2. The French Language is also introduced to our students from Year 4. All Muslim students will avail Islamic Education classes from FS2. Moreover, we have the provision of Social Sciences A and B, Arabic A and B, as well as well as Islamic Education A and B for Arabs and Non-Arabs respectively.

ICT

Information and Communication Technology (ICT) is fully integrated into the curriculum to equip students with essential digital literacy and 21st-century skills. ICT is used not only as a subject but also as a tool to enhance learning across disciplines. Through platforms like Google Workspace for Education, coding, robotics, and multimedia projects, students engage in meaningful, tech-enabled learning that fosters creativity, collaboration, and problem-solving.

Music

Music plays a vital role in fostering creativity, self-expression, and cultural appreciation. Integrated into the curriculum from the early years, Music education develops students' auditory, vocal, and instrumental skills while enhancing their confidence and emotional well-being. Through performances, class activities, and cross-curricular connections, students experience music as both an art form and a means of communication.

Physical Education

Physical Education is a core element of our holistic approach to student development. The PE curriculum promotes physical fitness, teamwork, discipline, and resilience, while encouraging a healthy and active lifestyle. Students participate in a variety of sports and movement-based activities designed to enhance their motor skills, coordination, and overall well-being.

Art

Art education is an essential part of the curriculum, nurturing creativity, imagination, and self-expression. Through various mediums such as drawing, painting, sculpture, and digital art, students explore artistic techniques while developing critical thinking and visual communication skills.

Drama

Drama is an integral part of the curriculum for Years 4 to 9, promoting confidence, communication, and creative expression. Through role-play, performance, improvisation, and script work, students explore character, storytelling, and stagecraft. Drama supports emotional intelligence, collaboration, and empathy.

Design and Technology

Design and Technology (DT) for Years 7 to 9 empowers students to become innovative thinkers and problem-solvers. Through hands-on, project-based learning, students explore product design, materials, systems, and digital technologies. They apply critical thinking, creativity, and practical skills to design and prototype solutions that address real-world challenges. DT fosters independence, collaboration, and resilience, supporting the development of essential 21st-century competencies.

Assemblies/ Wellbeing Time

Assemblies are held during the week. Topics are based on DePS Skillset and Values. Individual year group hold a weekly assembly and individual children are acknowledged for their achievements and positive behavior through various awards and celebrations. Each class will present an assembly relating to their learning throughout the academic year.

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

We believe that good attendance and punctuality are vital in enabling students to make the most of their learning opportunities at Deira Private School. By attending every day, research indicates:

- Students who develop good patterns of attendance and punctuality early on at school tend to continue in this pattern throughout their school life and beyond.

92%-93%	ACCEPTABLE- No more than 15 days absent per school year.
Below 92%	UNSATISFACTORY - 15 days or more absent per school year.

If your child is unwell or has an unforeseen absence from school, please email class teacher or the school medical team at amahmood@deiraprivateschool.ae at call the school before 8:00 AM. Absences for sickness that last for 3 days or longer will require medical certification.

ABSENCES

Absences may be authorised or unauthorised. Only exceptional circumstances warrant an authorised leave of absence. The school will consider each application individually and the absence will only be authorised if the student is absent with permission from the Principal/SLT. Please write at communications@deiraprivateschool.ae.

UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE

Absence not supported with a valid reason, that has not been communicated to the school or prior approval sought from the Principal/ SLT will be categorised as 'unauthorised absence'. Unauthorised absences will be monitored and may be addressed with the parent/guardian.

If a student has more than 20 consecutive days or a total of 25 days unauthorised absence in an academic year, and the school reserves the right to review the student's re -enrollment for the next academic year.

It is the responsibility of the parent / guardian to inform the school of each day of absence and whether the absence will extend to include more than one day

SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY

IMPORTANT

Parents are kindly requested to refrain from using the parent WhatsApp groups to raise confidential concerns relating to behaviour, safeguarding or other grievances that concerning other students or members of staff. All sensitive concerns should be directed to the designated staff member via email to maintain confidentiality in compliance with the KHDA regulations.

COMMUNICATION COMMITMENTS

Email: Staff will endeavor to respond to emails usually within 24, but during exceptionally busy periods, this may take 48 hours. Teachers are not permitted to answer emails during teaching time.

Telephone Calls: Telephone messages for staff should come through the main Reception and will be passed on the day they are received. Office staff should not interrupt teaching for staff to answer a telephone call. Staff will endeavor to call back within 24 hours. Staff are not permitted to use their own mobile phone to call parents.

Letters: Staff will respond to parents' letters within 48 hours (2 school days). Any letter of complaint must be referred to the Principal immediately and will follow the Complaints Procedures.

Class Dojo: Teachers will respond to comments from parents regarding a piece of child's work within 48 hours

Social Networking Sites: Designated administrative staff are the only staff members permitted to communicate via social networking. Teachers are not permitted to communicate with parents or pupils via social networking sites or accept them as "friends".

Meetings with staff: Staff will not be available for 'chats' at the start and end of the day as it is their time with children but will be as flexible as possible in accommodating urgent requests for meetings either face to face or online. For longer meetings, more often than not, it is best to make an appointment. Appointments can be made through the main Reception or by emailing the staff.

HEALTHY SCHOOL MEALS

Here, at Deira Private School, we encourage our students to develop healthy eating habits from an early age. Students are encouraged to socialise and practise their table manners as they eat. Students must bring labelled bottles of drinking water every day.

A variety of nut, egg and pork containing food items and beverages are prohibited in the school. At Deira Private School, no nut products or pork products are permitted - this includes all nut products, Nutella chocolate spread, and peanut butter. Please note that junk food, such as crisps, chocolates, and fizzy drinks are not allowed in our school. Some great tiffin snacks are carrot sticks, cucumber, raisins, prunes, fruit yoghurt, wholemeal bread sandwiches, pasta, and rice cakes.

Students tiffins are monitored for healthy snacks and healthy tiffin certificates are given to encourage healthy eating.

Thank you, in advance, for your cooperation in ensuring the safety and well-being of our whole school community. We also ask parents to make their children aware that we do not share food to ensure we are respectful of all the other religious beliefs concerning food products.

BIRTHDAYS

We fully understand the sheer joy and excitement of sharing/distributing food (cake, cupcakes, sweets, etc.) on special occasions like a birthday or a religious occasion, but we also have to keep in mind that a few children are allergic to certain ingredients present in such treats (eggs, gluten, nuts, dairy, etc.) Among these, a few students are aware of their allergy but many allergies remain undiscovered until later in life, hence any accidental exposure to such food might result in allergic reactions ranging in severity from mild (itching, hives, rash, sneezing, etc.) to severe including anaphylactic shock.

Hence, we request the parents to limit the birthday treats to UAE compliant books and other non-food items only, and avoid sending any kind of processed/packaged foods. Birthday cakes and food items are NOT PERMITTED.

Procedure

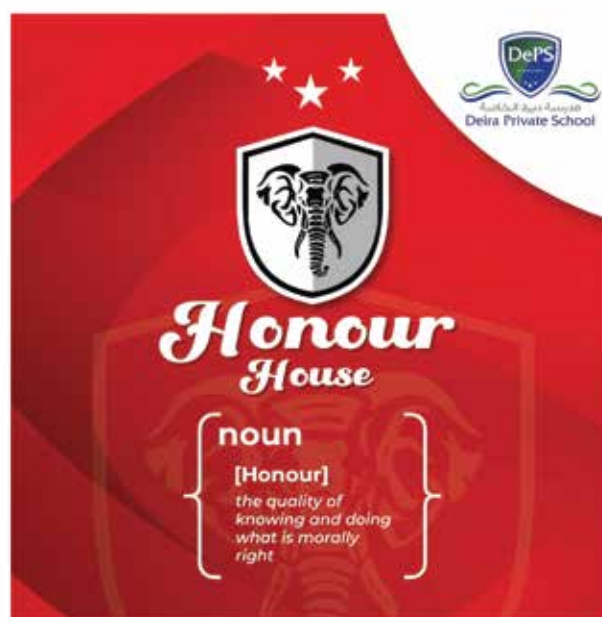
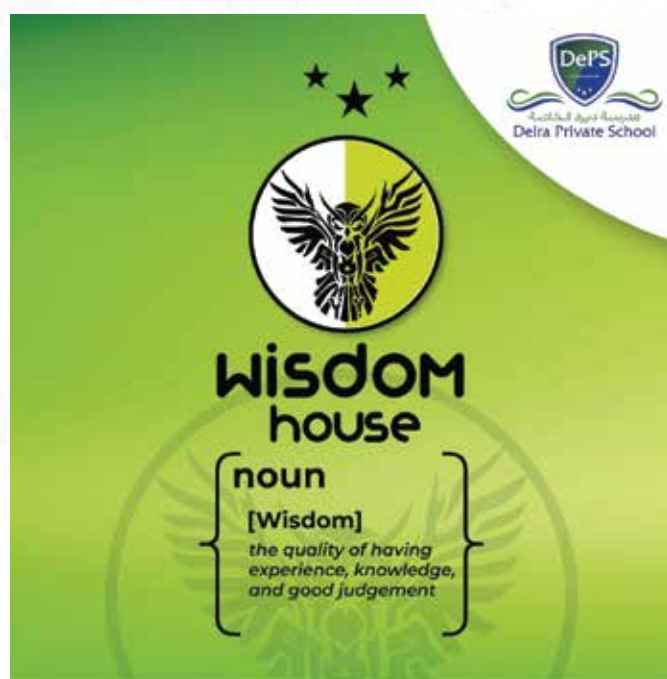
1. Inform the Class Teacher by calling the School Reception, a day in advance of your plan. No celebration will be permitted, if the school is not informed in advance.
2. The celebration is carried out at break time only as this helps in preventing too much of a disturbance in the children's regular school schedule of the day.

SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS

We, at Deira Private School, take pride in welcoming students with a wide range of different needs as we aim to offer an inclusive environment for all children to learn, grow, and blossom in. We aim to ensure all students are included regardless of race, nationality, disability, or cultural background. We see the diversity of our student and staff population as one of our greatest assets to our school. We make every attempt to ensure every student has full access to all areas of learning both academically, socially, and emotionally to ensure they reach their full potential and become lifelong learners.

Led by our Head of Inclusion, we have an experienced team of specialist inclusion teachers and support staff who are dedicated to working alongside teachers to support students and parents in the identification of and provision for an individual student's specific or exceptional needs.

The SEND department ensures a bespoke system is in place to guarantee quality provision and inclusive practices are implemented through personalized programmes, assessments, curriculum adaptations, and modifications such as: Growth and learning opportunities with DePS (GLOW), Milestones Based Transition Programme, English Language Learners (ELL), Gifted and Talented (G&T) support and through a collaborative approach with all professionals working with the student (if needed)

Our determination to cultivate and maintain an inclusive ethos of the highest quality is fundamental to our school. We define, implement, and review all of our policies to promote inclusion, and have developed policies to tackle abusive behaviour, such as racism and/or bullying if it emerges.

We also ensure that at Deira Private School, students themselves have a prominent voice in all matters that affect them, and that we act fairly, decisively, and timely in dealing with any behaviour that is contrary to our inclusive ethos. At all times, we seek to provide exemplary leadership as role models ourselves.

Parents to ensure availability of LSA in case a need is identified by the Inclusion department.

The provision of LSA may be required in the classroom as well as in bus.

To ensure students safety and security, identified students without LSA will not be allowed to use school bus services.

STUDENT BEHAVIOUR EXPECTATIONS

At DePS, we have a positive and inclusive approach to managing behaviour. We believe in developing positive relationships through a restorative approach, which promotes self-esteem, and self-discipline and establishes clear expectations for all members of the school community. Recognition, praise, and encouragement are used as much as possible in all situations. It is the responsibility of teachers to share the expectations, rewards, and consequences with their students in the best way they see fit.

- **House Points** to encourage teamwork and school spirit
- **Verbal Praise** for immediate, meaningful feedback
- **ClassDojo Points** to track and celebrate individual progress
- **Certificates and Awards** to recognise accomplishments
- **Recognition in Assemblies** to celebrate student contributions publicly
- **Display of Student Work** to showcase creativity and effort

These practices help build confidence, promote a growth mindset, and create a culture of encouragement and pride across the school.

DePS EXPECTATIONS CODE

All staff and students should always adhere to the following three rules:

1. Respect yourself

- Think before you act and speak
- Be on time and attend lessons and work hard
- Be tidy, clean, and safe in the classrooms, cafeteria, and playground
- Always wear the correct uniform with pride.

2. Respect others

- Be thankful and grateful for the other students, teachers, and staff. Follow adults' instructions the first time
- Value everyone as equal; regardless of nationality, race, colour, religion, or disability...
- DePS is one big family; do not let anyone down
- Appreciate others' viewpoints and the right to be heard.
- Listen to others and speak in turns.

3. Respect your school

- Leave classrooms and other areas tidy, just like you would expect to find them
- Support the school to be a 'greener' environmentally friendly building
- Always be positive about the school to visitors, guests, and peers who attend other schools
- Move around school sensibly, quietly, safely, and always on the right

All rules are observable, and it is the responsibility of every adult in school to reinforce the school rules.

Rewards:

We believe deeply in the importance of promoting and praising good behaviour. The role of rewards and praise is a key component of developing the potential of all students at DePS. Students' efforts, achievements and good behaviour are rewarded and celebrated by teachers and staff in many ways. The following presents the breakdown of our points system where students will be rewarded points when completing one of the positive actions weekly, monthly, or termly. Along with some intriguing rewards for the students to pick from with their points.

Sanctions At DePS:

At DePS, our main purpose is the promotion of positive behaviour. We do this by recognising potential and celebrating success. However, we also know that it is important to have appropriate sanctions, which are fair and applied consistently. These sanctions are intended to encourage students to reflect on their behaviour and choices, and as a result, make better choices in the future. Negative points will be given to students when the school's expectations and policies are not followed. The positive and negative points accumulated over the term are added together. The negative points are then deducted from the overall positive points.

BEHAVIOUR SUPPORT SERVICES

At DePS we emphasize the importance of cultivating self-care, appreciating personal differences, caring and advocating for others, and becoming global citizens. Implemented through various behaviour support services dedicated to creating a safe, respectful and supportive school community in becoming confident, adaptable, and open-minded critical thinkers who will embrace multiculturalism and thrive in a diverse and changing world.

ASSESSMENT

To identify and support students with behavioural or emotional needs, a combination of behavioural observations and standardised assessments such as CAT4 (Cognitive Abilities Test) which assesses students' cognitive strengths and weaknesses across verbal, non-verbal, quantitative, and spatial reasoning. This helps identify any learning barriers that may impact behaviour, such as frustration due to processing difficulties or academic mismatch and PASS (Pupil Attitudes to Self and School) that measures students' attitudes towards school, learning, teachers, and themselves. Low scores may indicate issues like low self-esteem, disengagement, or anxiety—factors that often manifest as behavioural concerns.

Combined with teacher input, classroom observations, and previous interventions, these assessments help build a fuller picture of the student's needs. The results guide the creation of behaviour support plans, referrals to pastoral or counselling services, and help tailor strategies for individual support.

COUNSELLING

The mission of Deira Private School Counselling department, which is led by a full-time Counsellor, is to support the well-being of all students, staff, and parents by offering an equitable, developmentally-appropriate, comprehensive, preventative, and accessible school-counselling team. The team abides by national ethical standards to enable students to achieve their full potential.

COLLABORATIVE APPROACH

At our school, behaviour support services are delivered through a collaborative approach involving teachers, leadership, parents, and support staff. This partnership ensures a consistent, positive, and proactive environment where student wellbeing is prioritised. By working together, we identify needs early, implement personalised support plans, and foster a culture of respect, inclusion, and shared responsibility across the school community.

Behaviour on School Bus:

The school reserves the right to withdraw the services temporarily or permanently for students that break the bus rules persistently. The rules that apply during the rest of the school day will apply on the bus. Bus Monitor will record any consequences on a behaviour slip and pass these to the transport manager. These will be passed to the counsellor and will be added to the behaviour record for that day. Students are expected to behave sensibly in buses.

The students MUST:

- follow the Bus Monitor at all times.
- must always remain seated while the bus is in motion.
- must wear a seatbelt while on the bus.
- must not block the aisle with bags or their legs.
- must keep their noise level to a minimal level.
- are not to exit the bus until it comes to a full stop.
- Students must leave the bus in an orderly manner.
- Students must refrain from distracting the bus driver.

Bus monitors would warn the students and give them an opportunity to modify their behaviour. If however, the students refuse to modify their behaviour, sanctions shall be applied. The school reserves the right to take appropriate actions that are proportional to the violations of any of its rules and regulations. This may lead to suspension from bus for a number of days or permanently depending on the severity/regularity of offence as per the school policy.
